Notes:

1) "Institutionalized population" includes people under formally authorized, supervised care or custody.

Example settings include: nursing homes, mental hospitals, hospitals or wards for the chronically ill, correctional institutions, juvenile institutions, etc.

2) "Noninstitutionalized population" includes people who live in group quarters other than institutions. Staff residing in military and nonmilitary group quarters on institutional grounds are included here.

Example settings include: college dormitories and college quarters off campus, military quarters, group homes, religious group quarters, crews of maritime vessels, shelters, soup kitchens, etc.
